 State Accountability Update: Ms. Keisha Redd-Hannans 	Overview presented on Connecticut's accountability system – a set of 12 indicators school's preparation for college, career and life for its students. Accountability index indicators was presented. District accountability report revealed a decrease in performance level of students. There was an increase in the growth rate of each student.
