Dr. Tracey highlighted School District's mission, vision, and 5 priority areas as focal points for the District.

Operations

Hundreds of students and parents passed trough the Que House. Books and snacks were given to K4 families and students as gifts. Congratulation extended to Gemma Josephs and team for organizing.

Budget Development Calendar 2022 – 2023

Upcoming budget deficit projected for the upcoming year. This information will be shared with at the next F & O meeting and the Board.

COVID/Test and Staff – Dr. Paul Whyte COVID -19 Update in Schools

Increased cases of COVID-19 observed after thanks-giving in schools. Entire classes have been suspended in some schools (7th and 8th grades) and remote learning activated.

Water Bottles

Testing participation continues. Some schools testing have begun with approximately 325 tests administered. Weekly tests are encouraged. Reminder to families – if household members are being tested, students or siblings should remain home. Water filling stations is scheduled for delivery to the schools on February 1st 2022.

School Threats

Difficulty was experienced as threats towards the different schools in the District became a crisis. Perpetrators were identified which caused Wilbur Cross School to be on lock-down and school closing. Threats flooded the schools with racial slur and arrests were made by the police.

Teacher Retention

Analysis on teacher's retention resulted that between 2018 and 2021, approximately the same number of teachers left the District for varied categories and reasons. District continues make this a concern and pledge to do all to retain our staff. Dr. Tracey reported that various school Districts have offered salary increases and as a result the NHPS teachers are being poached. She encouraged the Board to enter into upcoming salary negotiations with an intent offer salary increase

Transportation Update Mr. Lamb

Monitored driver shortage and bus performance to achieve stable driver accommodation. Progress made in driver acquisition. 1 new hire to commence today. 15 passenger vans have been purchased by First Student bus company to provide additional transport. Routes have been delegated to serve. Bonuses to recruit new applicant continues. Customer service telephone lines established by First Student.
