• NHPS Footsteps to Brilliance Pilot Results – Ms. Viviana Conner and Ms. Ivelise Velazquez	Update. Footsteps to Brilliance is an award-winning pre-k to grade 3, digital literacy program piloted in 5 NHPS, February – May 2022. Schools were Bishop Woods, John Martinez, Back Obama, F.A.M.E. and King Robinson. It allows teachers to personalize instruction a well as assist parents t support their children. Grant fund is awarded to enable parents to accomplish the suppor process. The program also allows students accessibility of English to Spanish with a customized program of teachers' instructions. All teachers go through level 1 and 2 training. Results of the pilot was successful with students reading hundreds of books during this period. Students' writing, reading and comprehension are covered. Oral reading fluency increased dramatically during the 4 months. The program gives a balance on students' needs. This will be offered in 4 schools during the summer programs. Student learning will continue with student while at home during this summer.
• H-CAP Update – Ms. Keisha Hannans	Health Academy Pathway at Hill House High School HCAP is a program that is in Partnership with Gateway Community College. Eighteen (18) students participated in the cohort pilot program with GPA ranged from 1.5 to 4.0. Fourteen students (14) are progessing to the fall semester of which with four achieved A grades throughout this school year.
	Highlights of the program Workshop with Yale Alumni health care professionals – student introduced to a variety of health careers. Meet and greet with students at the Gateway with half of our cohorts. Cohorts were offered the opportunity to peruse all Gateway heath care labs. Students will take 6 college credits for the new school year. Summer Enrichment program will convene during July 18 and -29.
