Overview: ARP ESSER



New Haven Public Schools Allocation: \$79,961,069

LEAs must reserve 20% of their allocation to address learning loss through the implementation of evidence-based interventions and ensure those interventions:

- Set Aside: \$15,992,214
- Respond to students social, emotional, and academic needs
- Address disproportionate impact of underrepresented subgroups

Commitment to Equity




It is our collective responsibility to fulfill the established priorities through an equity-focused lens.

Safe Return to In-Person Instruction Plan and Continuity of Services Plan



LEAs receiving funds must, within 30 days of receiving funds (June 23), make publicly available on its website a plan for the safe return to in-person instruction and continuity of services.

Federal mandate requires:

- Must be made publicly available online. It is also required that these plans be in an understandable and uniform format
- LEAshall seek public comment prior to publishing and take such comments into account in the development of the plan
- If an LEAdeveloped a plan before ARP was enacted that does not address the outlined requirements but otherwise complied with the requirements for public posting and comments, the LEAmust revise its plan **no later than six months after it last reviewed its plan**.
- Plan must be updated at least every six months through September 30, 2023

LEA ARP ESSER Plan



- LEAs are required to develop a plan for the use of ARP ESSER funds and submit that plan to the state.
- At aminimum, the plan must include:
 - How funds will be used to implement prevention and mitigation strategies consistent with CDC guidelines
 - How LEA will utilize 20% reserve for learning loss. LEAs will need to demonstrate how they measure and address the academic impact of lost instructional time utilizing evidence-based activities including:
 - Summer learning and enrichment
 - Extended school days
 - Comprehensive afterschool programs
 - Extended school year

LEA ARP ESSER Plan (continued)



At a minimum the plan must include (continued):

- How the LEAwill spend the remaining funds in accordance with section 2001(e)(2) of the American Relief Plan Act of 2021
- How the LEAwill address the academic, social, emotional and mental health needs of all students, in particular disadvantaged populations, including students from lowincome families, students of color, English learners, children with disabilities, students experiencing homelessness, children and youth in foster care, and migratory students
- LEAsmust demonstrate that they had meaningful stakeholder engagement and input into their plan
- The LEAARP ESSER Plan may be consolidated with the Safe Return to In-Person Instruction and Continuity of Services Plan
 - These plans will inform how the LEA completes their ARP ESSER application

Required Meaningful Consultation



LEAs must engage in meaningful consultation with stakeholders when creating their ARP ESSER plan

- The description must include how the LEA provided the public the opportunity to provide input in the development of the plan, a summary of the input (including any letters of support), and how the LEA took such input into account
- LEAs should consult Connecticut's Framework for Family Engagement, their local RES, SERC, and the CCSSO's handbook for assistance
