The New Haven School District was allocated \$8,017.233 and as per each LEA, 20% should be reserved to address learning loss due to COVID-19. Requested evidenciary implementation of fund utilization have begun in our schools, deferring \$16,003,447.00 to cover all projects. This allocation responds to social, emotional and academic needs as well as address disproportionate impact of the under-represented sub-group by the pandemic.

As a result of the ten hours of live remote instruction hours students who are quarantined received, it was intensely discussed the need for a virtual academy in the school District. It was revealed that there is a shortage of teachers which limits the amount of instruction hours a quarantined student receives. As a result, Board members supported the idea and suggested that a virtual academy be established. Dr. Whyte reported that elements for virtual academy for high school students is been developed. He further added that it is a current State policy that live remote

Instructional Frameworks defines how we teach – expectation of teachers Common guiding principles used by all content areas to build framework was highlighted. Each framework has core practices e.g. argument writing. Professional learning focus on student activity consistently. This is structured to know what all schools are instructing. This enable the District to know where to invest for growth in student instructional framework. DISCUSSION It was reported and discussed that students from the community attended Hill-House High School soccer game —(approximately 1500 students between 8 grade and high came to watch the football game). However, a group of children outside the school attended the game only to engage in a fight. It got out of control and the Police had to be called in to control and break up fights. As a result, the Superintendent decided temporarily, hat for all other games students' parents had to be present to enable their attendance for future games. Mr. Fiore - Student excited to be back in school and adhering to mask wearing. Water fountain closed in the school. Need timeframe on when water fountains will be reopened to prevent student sharing water bottled in school. Mr. Lamb reported that a prototype is been worked on for different types of water fountains which will arrive this week. Ms. Roman – Students are sad, normalcy has not returned to the school community. Concerns were raised regarding students' continual use of computers in school.
