VI. Superintendent Report: Dr. Iline Tracey	Dr. Jackson inquired regarding nurses in our schools; if the District or the City employs them. Dr. Tracey stated that she would write up a list of schools that do not have nurses staffed. She will discuss with the Health Dept. Mr. Conaway adds the same should be done for the lack of bus monitors. Ms. Lisa Mack adds that 17 individuals are currently interviewed for the position.

ii. WeConnect Community Campaign Launch:	Ms. Typhanie Jackson discussed with the Board the importance of WeConnect especially during the time of the pandemic. It is critical for all to know and understand that we are all working together, and that you are not alone. February 24 <sup>th</sup> is Day of Healing, a day of workshop offerings for students/families and staff, providing a variety of choices around wellness. The campaign is not just for this singular day, there are more activities to come.
iii. 2021-2022 General Fund Budget	Mr. Penn presented the Proposed General Fund Budget included in the Other Materials for the board to review and discuss. The Report detailed Key Trends in enrollment, and in Grants New Haven receives. He also relays to the Board the difference of the Budget from last year and this year, which shows an increase of ~\$8.8million.

X. Governance Report:	Dr. Jackson updates regarding the SRO design committee, they have a report to present at the next governance meeting; shall be present at the next Board meeting for first read, and advises at least 2 thorough reads prior to discussion with the board members.
	The second read for Conduct and Discipline policy available, which was in the works before now. I read a document about suspensions and how districts are ranked on how many suspensions occur (Tier 1 Low, Tier 2 Medium, Tier 3 High, Tier 4 consistently High) New Haven is Tier 2., due to the District listening to students teachers and how to avoid future suspensions.
	Mr. Conaway adds that there should be an addition to the Post-Covid model, to include the hybrid and virtual classrooms as well. Dr. Jackson stated that it has been discussed and that she will further discuss it at the next meeting.

He adds there was a bit of a challenge delivering food on the previous snow days the District had. He states that families that are Covid + can receive food if picked up and abide by the protocols in place at the locations.
XIII. Compensation Equity Committee Report:	Mr. Conaway states the last meeting was January 27, 2021 there are two committees (i) Job Description (ii) Information on Surrounding Towns. Meetings are the last Wednesday of the Month. He adds with Dr. Tracey that he would like to add Part Timers on the Equity Agenda.
XIV. Facilities Naming Report:	Next Meeting is on April 15, 2021. Ms. Rivera takes the opportunity to reiterate the forwarding of appointees to the renaming of Columbus committee.
XV. Citywide School Building Stewardship Report:	Next Meeting is on February 11, 2021. Dr. Jackson asks about the School Funding through the Biden Administration. Dr. Tracey states no information is available at this time, Mayor Elicker adds any federal funding is welcomed by the District.
