Superintendent's Report • Covid Compliance Update / Testing / Vaccinations – Dr. Paul Whyte	Implement a broad vocabulary across the District  Dr Tracey – Clinics are being set up at school sites for student testing. Five to Eleven-year-olds are now eligible for testing. Parent meeting will be convened this Wednesday for discussion and questions.  Dr. Whyte reported that, Governor Lamont's Executive Order, 13G was implemented in August 2021 – which requires all state employees to be vaccinated. There are Four Thousand and seventy-nine staff members, of which 3730 are fully vaccinated. There are 349 in testing pool. Testing results are updated weekly. Staff has been in full compliance with testing as well as vaccine. This will remain in effect until the executive order is lifted.  COVID Project Planet Detect. Presently, only students are been individually tested. Two Hundred and forty fours students have been registered for testing.
