AGREEMENT By And Between The New Haven Board of Education AND

(The Boys and Girls Club of Greater New Haven)

FOR DEPARTMENT/PROGRAM:

(Youth, Family, and Community Engagement)

This Agreement entered into on the 18th day of October 2022, effective (<u>no sooner than the day after Board of Education Approval</u>), the 15th day of November 2022, by and between the New Haven Board of Education (herein referred to as the "Board" and, The Boys and Girls Club of Greater New Haven located at, 253 Columbus Ave. New Haven, CT 06519 (herein referred to as the "Contractor".

Compensation: The Board shall pay the contractor for satisfactory performance of services required the amount of \$500 per day for a total of 136 days, for a total of \$68,000 per (2) schools. \$800 per day, for a total of 136 days, for a total of \$108,800 at (1) School. \$5,250 per day for a total of 5 days, for a total of \$26,250

The maximum amount the contractor shall be paid under this agreement: Two Hundred and Seventy-One Thousand, and Fifty dollars and Zero cents. (\$271,050.00). Compensation will be made upon submission of an itemized invoice which includes a detailed description of work performed and date of service.

Fiscal support for this Agreement shall be by ESSER II **Program** of the New Haven Board of Education, **Account Number**: 2552-6363-56697 **Location Code**: 0021 (\$108,800). **Account Number**: 2552-6363-56697 **Location Code**: 0003 (\$68,000). **Account Number**: 2552-6363-56697 **Location Code**: 0043 (\$68,000). **Account Number**: 2552-6363-56697 **Location Code**: 0444 (\$26,250).

This agreement shall remain in effect from November 15, 2022 to June 30, 2023.

SCOPE OF SERVICE:

- The Boys and Girls Club will service (50) students at Bishop Woods and Beecher Schools, (80) students at Brennan Rogers, and (70) students at their Columbus Ave location for Spring Break for a total of (250) students for extended school hours programming from November 15, 2022 until June 30, 2023. The Boys and Girls Club will provide students with an array of programs that focus on (3) areas of engagement. The Power Hour provides 30 minutes of homework and academic support to enhance academic performance. The Triple play is designed to educate students on healthy habits to improve overall well-being by introducing them to nutrition, and various forms of physical activity. The Torch Club is a leadership group that promotes community service, enhances character development as they prepare for their lives outside of school.

HOLD HARMLESS: The Contractor shall insure and/or indemnify the Board and its members, employees and agents against all claims, suits, and expenses, including reasonable attorney's fees, in connection with loss of life, bodily injury or property damage arising from any neglect act or omission of the Contractor or its employees or agents. Further, the Contractor covenants and agrees that it shall hold the Board and its members, employees and agents harmless against any and all claims, suits judgments of any description whatsoever caused by the Contractor' breach of this agreement or based upon the conduct of the Contractor, or its agents or its employees or arising out of in connection with their activities under this agreement.

TERMINATION: The Board may cancel this agreement for any reason upon thirty (30) days' written notice sent to the Contractor by certified U.S. mail, return receipt requested; provided however, that the Board shall be responsible to the Contractor for all services rendered by the Contractor through the last day of thirty (30) day notice period, as long as the Agreement was approved by the Board prior to the start date of service.

EXHIBIT B

STUDENT DATA PRIVACY AGREEMENT SPECIAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

For the purposes of this Exhibit B "directory information," "de-identified student information," "school purposes," "student information," "student records," "student- generated content," and "targeted advertising" shall be as defined by Conn. Gen. Stat.§10-234aa.

- 1. All student records, student information, and student-generated content (collectively, "student data") provided or accessed pursuant this Agreement or any other services agreement between the Parties are not the property of, or under the control of, the Contractor.
- 2. The Board shall have access to and the ability to delete student data in the possession of the Contractor except in instances where such data is (A) otherwise prohibited from deletion or required to be retained under state or federal law, or (B) stored as a copy as part of a disaster recovery storage system and that is (i) inaccessible to the public, and (ii) unable to be used in the normal course of business by the Contractor. The Board may request the deletion of any such student information, student records or student-generated content if such copy has been used by the operator to repopulate accessible data following a disaster recovery. The Board may request the deletion of student data by the contractor within two (2) business days of receiving such a request and provide to the Board confirmation via electronic mail that the student data has been deleted in accordance with the request, the date of its deletion, and the manner in which it has been deleted. The confirmation shall contain a written assurance from the Contractor that proper disposal of the data has occurred in order to prevent the unauthorized access or use of student data and that deletion has occurred in accordance with industry standards/practices/protocols.
- 3. The Contractor shall not use student data for any purposes other than those authorized pursuant to this Agreement.
- 4. A student, parent or legal guardian of a student may review personally identifiable information contained in student data and correct any erroneous information, if any, in such student data. If the Contractor receives a request to review student data in the Contractor's possession directly from a student, parent, or guardian, the Contractor agrees to refer that individual to the Board and to notify the Board within two (2) business days of receiving such a request. The Contractor agrees to work cooperatively with the Board to permit a student, parent, or guardian to review personally identifiable information in student data that has been shared with the Contractor, and correct any erroneous information therein.

- 5. The Contractor shall take actions designed to ensure the security and confidentiality of student data.
- 6. The Contractor will notify the Board, in accordance with Conn. Gen. Stat. § 10-234dd, when there has been an unauthorized release, disclosure or acquisition of student data. Such notification will include the following steps:

Upon discovery by the Contractor of a breach of student data, the Contractor shall conduct an investigation and restore the integrity of its data systems and, without unreasonable delay, but not more than thirty (30) days after such discovery, shall provide the Board with a more detailed notice of the breach, including but not limited to the date and time of the breach; name(s) of the student(s) whose student data was released, disclosed or acquired; nature of and extent of the breach; and measures taken to ensure that such a breach does not occur in the future.

- 7. Student data shall not be retained or available to the Contractor upon expiration of the contract between the Contractor and Board, except a student, parent or legal guardian of a student may choose independently to establish or maintain an electronic account with the Contractor after the expiration of such contract for the purpose of storing student-generated content.
- 8. The Contractor and Board shall each ensure their own compliance with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, 20 U.S.C. § 1232g, as amended from time to time.
- 9. The Contractor acknowledges and agrees to comply with the above and all other applicable aspects of Connecticut's Student Data Privacy law according to Connecticut General Statutes §§ 10-234aa through 10-234dd.
- 10. The Parties agree that this Agreement controls over any inconsistent terms or conditions contained within any other agreement entered into by the Parties concerning student data.

Dear Gemma,

The Boys & Girls Clubs of Greater New Haven is so happy to be able to partner with the New Haven Schools again this year to provide after school care and programming to the children at Bishop Woods, Beecher and Brennan Rodgers.

We are proposing an October 24, 2022 start at all three schools Monday – Friday on full days when school is in session. We will not provide any services on half days. Our proposal includes up to 50 children at both Bishop Woods and Beecher and up to 80 children at Brennan Rodgers. Should the numbers increase above those thresholds, we will charge \$12/child per day based on actuals of less than 10 additional students. If the number of additional students reaches 10 than we will charge \$10/day per student for increments of 10.

We are also proposing similar to last year that that up to 70 children from the three schools join us at our Columbus Avenue Club House during April Recess. The cost provided in the attached proposal assumes that the New Haven School will provide breakfast, lunch and snacks. If food is not included, there will be an increase in cost by an extra \$10/child per day for food.

It is critical to our success that we staff these sites appropriately to be able to provide a safe environment, mentoring, homework help and fun programs for the children. Our operating costs exceed what is being proposed to you. We will be subsidizing to ensure that the New Haven children at these three sites are well taken care of. Please let me know if you have any questions or concerns.

After School Care (10/24/2022 - 6/14/2023)

Sessions will be 2.5 - 3 hours in length, running on all full days that school is in session, Monday through Friday. We will not provide any services on half days.

Should the numbers increase above the thresholds in this proposal, we will charge \$12/child per day based on actuals. The reason for this increase is that BGCGNH will need to hire additional staff in order to maintain a safe student to staff ratio (1:10). For any actuals less than 10 students BGCGNH still needs to pay the additional staff member but will not be collecting enough money from New Haven Schools to break even. If the number of students increases by 10 than the rate will be \$10/child per day for each increment of 10.

Spring Break (April 10, 2023 – April 14, 2023)

Up to 70 children from the three schools can join us at our Columbus Avenue Club House during April Recess.

The New Haven School will provide breakfast, lunch and snacks. If food is not included, the cost increase will be an extra \$10/child per day for food.
