A needs assessment was completed as part of our school improvement plan. Areas of need emerged from multiple stakeholders. These areas include increased student engagement and the need to encourage collaborative work amongst students. By partnering with Common Ground these needs will be met. This contractor fills the needs of FAME students and staff by embedding a naturalist into our schedule. Each classroom in K - 5 will visit our outdoor classroom and work with the naturalist once a week to explore science topics through the use of hands-on learning activities.

Students will be engaged in science activities and work collaboratively as they study nature in our outside learning environment. The service will be monitored through feedback from participants, teacher observation/feedback, & our SPMT.

b. If this is a renewal/continuation service attach a copy of the evaluation or archival data that demonstrates effectiveness.
Teachers and principals were surveyed at the end of the school year to give feedback on the Common Ground program. Results indicated that all schools benefited from the program. 83% of respondents indicated that the program was a 5/5. Seventy percent of respondents stated that the program met their social emotional goals, while half the respondents found that their goals for environmental awareness, schoolyard stewardship, and physical/mental health were met.

a. How is this service aligned to the District Continuous Improvement Plan?

This service is aligned to multiple goals in the district's Strategic Operating Plan. Kindergarten through grade 5 students participating in the Common Ground program will have a stronger foundation in early learning. Additionally, goal number two, high achievement for all learners, will also be a focus for our Common Ground partnership by allowing all K - 5 students to participate in the enrichment component. Finally, the Common Ground partnership truly focuses on development of the whole child (goal 3) by providing enrichment activities focused on teamwork, collaboration, and scientific discovery.

- 12. Why do you believe this Agreement is fiscally sound? This agreement is fiscally sound because it provides enrichment services for all K 5 students this academic year. The enrichment services provided are engaging activities that promote inquiry, problem solving & cooperation skills, as well as overall cognitive abilities by making naturalistic observations.
- 13. What are the implications of not approving this Agreement?

If this agreement is not approved, students will not get to experience outdoor learning and support from an embedded naturalist. Students would not have the experiential activities that would be provided by embedding a naturalist 2 days per week at our building. Students will not have access to positive interactive activities and thus potentially increasing student feelings of isolation. Therefore, the agreement with Common Ground offers students the opportunity to participate in enrichment activities & social experiences that Common Ground could provide. Without this partnership, students and staff would not have the opportunity to use outdoor learning spaces to the same depth and reinforce social emotional skills in an additional setting.

This agreement shall remain in effect from September 21, 2022 to June 8, 2023.

SCOPE OF SERVICE: In the space below, please provide brief summary of service.

Common Ground educators will engage students in Kindergarten through Fifth Grade in activities in our outdoor learning space to support the curricular integration of outdoor learning and encourage collaborative work. Hands-on activities and lessons will include learning activities exploring the courtyard garden, learning about the animals and plants that live there, nature study, and engaging in collaborative learning activities. Through hands-on exploration and engagement, student engagement and collaboration will increase and use of our outdoor learning space will be embedded into the school schedule. Further, the Contractor covenants and agrees that it shall hold the Board and its members, employees and agents harmless against any and all claims, suits judgments of any description whatsoever caused by the Contractor' breach of this agreement or based upon the conduct of the Contractor, or its agents or its employees or arising out of in connection with their activities under this agreement.

TERMINATION: The Board may cancel this agreement for any reason upon thirty (30) days' written notice sent to the Contractor by certified U.S. mail, return receipt requested; provided however, that the Board shall be responsible to the Contractor for all services rendered by the Contractor through the last day of thirty (30) day notice period, as long as the Agreement was approved by the Board prior to the start date of service.

EXHIBIT B

STUDENT DATA PRIVACY AGREEMENT SPECIAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

For the purposes of this Exhibit B "directory information," "de-identified student information," "school purposes," "student information," "student records," "student- generated content," and "targeted advertising" shall be as defined by Conn. Gen. Stat.§10-234aa.

- 1. All student records, student information, and student-generated content (collectively, "student data") provided or accessed pursuant this Agreement or any other services agreement between the Parties are not the property of, or under the control of, the Contractor.
- 2. The Board shall have access to and the ability to delete student data in the possession of the Contractor except in instances where such data is (A) otherwise prohibited from deletion or required to be retained under state or federal law, or (B) stored as a copy as part of a disaster recovery storage system and that is (i) inaccessible to the public, and (ii) unable to be used in the normal course of business by the Contractor. The Board may request the deletion of any such student information, student records or student-generated content if such copy has been used by the operator to repopulate accessible data following a disaster recovery. The Board may request the deletion of student data by the contractor within two (2) business days of receiving such a request and provide to the Board confirmation via electronic mail that the student data has been deleted in accordance with the request, the date of its deletion, and the manner in which it has been deleted. The confirmation shall contain a written assurance from the Contractor that proper disposal of the data has occurred in order to prevent the unauthorized access or use of student data and that deletion has occurred in accordance with industry standards/practices/protocols.
- 3. The Contractor shall not use student data for any purposes other than those authorized pursuant to this Agreement.
- 4. A student, parent or legal guardian of a student may review personally identifiable information contained in student data and correct any erroneous information, if any, in such student data. If the Contractor receives a request to review student data in the Contractor's possession directly from a student, parent, or guardian, the Contractor agrees to refer that individual to the Board and to notify the Board within two (2) business days of receiving such a request. The Contractor agrees to work cooperatively with the Board to permit a student, parent, or guardian to review personally identifiable information in student data that has been shared with the Contractor, and correct any erroneous information therein.

- 5. The Contractor shall take actions designed to ensure the security and confidentiality of student data.
- 6. The Contractor will notify the Board, in accordance with Conn. Gen. Stat. § 10-234dd, when there has been an unauthorized release, disclosure or acquisition of student data. Such notification will include the following steps:

Upon discovery by the Contractor of a breach of student data, the Contractor shall conduct an investigation and restore the integrity of its data systems and, without unreasonable delay, but not more than thirty (30) days after such discovery, shall provide the Board with a more detailed notice of the breach, including but not limited to the date and time of the breach; name(s) of the student{s) whose student data was released, disclosed or acquired; nature of and extent of the breach; and measures taken to ensure that such a breach does not occur in the future.

- 7. Student data shall not be retained or available to the Contractor upon expiration of the contract between the Contractor and Board, except a student, parent or legal guardian of a student may choose independently to establish or maintain an electronic account with the Contractor after the expiration of such contract for the purpose of storing student-generated content.
- 8. The Contractor and Board shall each ensure their own compliance with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, 20 U.S.C. § 1232g, as amended from time to time.
- 9. The Contractor acknowledges and agrees to comply with the above and all other applicable aspects of Connecticut's Student Data Privacy law according to Connecticut General Statutes §§ 10-234aa through 10-234dd.
- 10. The Parties agree that this Agreement controls over any inconsistent terms or conditions contained within any other agreement entered into by the Parties concerning student data.

Feedback Summary Outdoor Learning Specialist 2021-22

We surveyed teachers and principals at the end of the school year to get their feedback on the program. On a scale of 1-5, with 1 being "hate it" and 5 being "love it," 83% of respondents rated the program a 5, or "loved it." All but one school wanted to have the program again next year, and that one school clarified that it was due to funding issues. 100% of respondents said that the program met their school's academic goals. Seventy percent said that the program met their social emotional goals, and half the respondents found that their goals for environmental awareness, schoolyard stewardship, and physical/mental health were met.

Respondents described benefits as including:

- Teachers were able to see beyond the classroom. Students learned observation skills.
- Socially students were more engaged. Students learned about the natural world all around them.
- Students were able to utilize space and learn about nature. It also helped students with their social emotional needs after returning to full in-person after being away from school due to pandemic.
- Kids loved it! We know outdoor learning is so important
- kids were excited about outdoor learning

Comments from respondents included:

- The program was fabulous on so many levels, especially during a pandemic. It allowed us at [school name] to use our outdoor learning spaces to enrich student learning. Our partner, [educator name], was FANTASTIC! Students and teachers built positive relationships with her. Students learned about real life science all around them. Students were excited to see flowers they planted bloom. They were able to taste things like homemade lemonade seasoned with fresh herbs. It was a valuable learning experience we'd like to continue.
- We loved that our students were able to use our outdoor space which was not being used. Students and teachers enjoyed working with [educator name]. She was amazing.
- Teachers were originally hesitant to participate in the outdoor program but when they saw how much the students enjoyed it, they gave great feedback for the program. I'm hoping next year that teachers will go outside with their own classes.
