The grant pays for the following the categories of stipends, contracted services, equipment, and other as follows:

Contracted Services

Our contracted services range across several services to address the needs of students with disabilities. These contracts include providing **direct speech and language services** as indicated by the individualized education plan, **behavioral support** for our classrooms that service students with Autism Spectrum Disorders. Additionally, the contracted services are to provide **support for students with Hearing Impairments** as well as to provide nursing support for students who are required to receive **individualized nursing**. The contracted service also provides us with the ability to provide **adaptive PE** for our students with disabilities. Lastly, the grant has contracts that address the department's goal to **address the foundational reading skills** for students with disability. Additionally, as the law has changed to include dyslexia as a disability category, the grant will provide us with the opportunity to train teachers to address this disability category.

Equipment

The allocated equipment line allows us to address the needs of students who require it by way of their IEP as well as to support our assistive technology goals.

Stipends

Stipends are provided for our 18-21 transition programs that enable our students to have work preparation beyond the traditional high school experience.

Salaries/Benefits

Eighty percent of the grant is spent on salaries and benefits. Although this may be true, this is a fraction of what is paid by the general fund for special education services —to include teacher benefits and salaries.
