A discussion ensued. No motion was made and no vote was taken.
- Series 3000 Policies: Mr. Wilcox reported that he will meet with City personnel about the new
 guidelines for procurement. He will also meet with Ms. Jackson regarding best approach to submit
 policies to the Governance Committee for review. Ms. Hannans reported that she is working with an
 intern who is assisting in a policy review for the Finance Department. A discussion ensued. No
 motion was made and no vote was taken.

Adjournment: A motion by Dr. Yarborough, seconded by Ms. Rivera to adjourn the meeting at 6:21 p.m., passed unanimously by Roll Call Vote: Dr. Yarborough, Yes; Ms. Rivera, Yes; Mr. Wilcox, Yes.

Turnaround Schools

- Identification of Turnaround Schools will occur every 3 years (i.e. 2021-22, 2024-25) and will use the three most recent years of data available
- Any school for which the three-year weighted average on the accountability index is less than or equal to the fifth percentile of Connecticut Title I Schools in their identification group is identified as a Turnaround School. (Cutoffs E/M=52.29, HS=49.63)
- Any high school with a six-year adjusted cohort graduation rate for all students that is less than 70% for each of the three most recent cohorts is identified as a Turnaround School.
- New Haven Turnaround Schools AL Troup, Brennan-Rogers, Clemente Leadership Academy, Wexler-Grant



Focus Schools

- Identification of Focus Schools will occur annually and will use the three most recent years of data
- Elementary/Middle Schools will be evaluated for growth in ELA and Math for High Needs Students (Indicator 2)
- High Schools will be evaluated on Subject Performance Index (SPI) for High Needs Students (Indicator 1)
- Any school at which the ELA growth (or SPI) for students with high needs falls in the lower 10% of schools in their identification group for three consecutive years will be identified as a Focus ELA school. Focus Math schools will be similarly identified using Math growth (or SPI) scores.
- Any high school with a six-year adjusted cohort graduation rate for high needs students that is less than 70% for each of the 3 most recent cohorts is identified as a Focus Graduation Rate school.
- New Haven Focus School James Hillhouse HS ELA & Math.



School Categories

Following the identification of Turnaround and Focus schools, the remaining schools are initially placed into category 1, 2, or 3 based on their score on the accountability index.

Category 1: 85-100 Category 2: 70-84.99 Category 3: 0-69.99

Schools initially placed into category 1 or 2 will drop one category if one or more of the following are present:

- An outlier achievement gap in ELA, Math, or Science;
- An outlier graduation gap based on six-year adjusted cohort graduation rate; or
- An assessment participation rate below 95% in any subject for either all students or students with high needs groups



Social-Emotional Learning and **Attendance**

Highly engaged students are 57% less likely to be chronically absent in school than students who report low engagement

Social-Emotional Learning and **Behavior**

Students who report low Social Awareness are 2.5x more likely to have one or more behavior incidents than students who report high Social Awareness.

Social-Emotional Learning and Coursework

Students who report high Self-Management are 75% less likely to face failing grades than students who report low Self-Management.






A More Nuanced View on Bullying & Harassment



While overall, students reported low instances of bullying, a third of students reported being verbally harassed due to their body type.








Student Experiences Varied Significantly by Gender



Students who identified as nonbinary, transgender, or genderqueer had significantly lower perceptions of school safety and belonging.







Area of Improvement: Sense of Belonging



While teachers had more favorable perceptions than students, both students and teachers reported significantly <u>lower</u> Sense of Belonging in 2022 than 2021.







Students

Ages of Attendance

In accordance with Connecticut General Statute 10-186, the Board of Education shall provide education for all persons five years of age and older, having attained age five on or before the first day of January of any school year, and under twenty-two years of age who is not a graduate of a high school or vocational school, except as provided in Connecticut General Statutes 10-233c and 10-233d. For purposes of establishing the residency of a child of a member of the armed forces, as defined in C.G.S. 27-103, and who is seeking enrollment in a district school, in which such child is not yet a resident, the Board shall accept the military orders directing such member to Connecticut or any other documents from the armed forces indicating the transfer of such member to Connecticut as proof of residency in the District.

Additionally, according to Connecticut General Statute 10-76d (b2), special education will be provided for children who have attained the age of three and who have been identified as being in need of special education, and whose educational potential will be irreparably diminished without special education.

Parents and those who have the control of children five years of age and over and under eighteen years of age, are obligated by Connecticut law to require their children to attend public day school or its equivalent in the district in which such child resides, unless such child is a high school graduate or the parent or person having control of such child is able to show that the child is elsewhere receiving equivalent instruction in the studies taught in the public schools. Students under age eighteen are subject to mandatory attendance laws unless they are at least seventeen and their parent/guardian, or other person having control of the child, consents to such child's removal from school. The parent or person shall exercise this option by personally appearing at the school district office to sign a withdrawal form. Such withdrawal form shall include an attestation from a guidance counselor, school counselor, or school administrator of the school that this district has provided the parent or person with information on the educational opportunities options available in the school system and in the community.

The parent or person having control of a child five years of age shall have the option of not sending the child to school until the child is six years of age. The parent or person having control of a child six years of age shall have the option of not sending the child to school until the child is seven years of age.

The above requirements are not to serve as barriers to immediate enrollment of students, designated as homeless or foster children as required by the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) and the McKinney-Vento Act as amended by the ESSA. The District shall work with the local child welfare agency, the school last attended, or other relevant agencies to obtain necessary enrollment documentation.

The parent/guardian of any child who is denied admission to the district's schools, or an unaccompanied minor, a student eighteen years of age or older, a homeless child or youth or an unaccompanied youth who is denied schooling on the basis of residency, or an agent or officer charged with the enforcement of the laws concerning attendance at school may request, in writing, a hearing by the Board of Education.

The parent or person shall exercise such option by personally appearing at the school district office and signing an option form. The district shall provide the parent or person with information on the educational opportunities available in the school system.

A child who has attained the age of seventeen and who has voluntarily terminated enrollment with parental consent in the district's schools and subsequently seeks readmission may be denied readmission for up to ninety school days from the date of such termination, unless such child seeks readmission to the District not later than ten (10) schooldays after such termination in which case the Board shall provide school accommodations to such child not later than three school days after such child seeks readmission.

A child who has attained the age of nineteen or older may be placed in an alternative school program or other suitable educational program if he/she cannot acquire a sufficient number of credits for graduation by age twenty-one.
