July 16, 2020 Presented by Chief Operating Officer, Michael Pinto & Joseph Barbarotta the Facilities Department, Go To Services



The Facilities Department is currently obtaining quotes to paint entire swimming pool areas as well as upgrade and replace antiquated pool equipment.
in all (5) schools; Cross, Hillhouse, Career, Martinez, Conte,

Martinez is in need of approximately \$400,000. for pool repairs including the entire dehumidification system that must be removed and replaced.

Hillhouse repairs and grouting pool surface costs are about \$33,597.

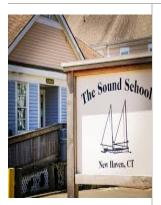
Conte filter media replacement \$21,025 Career needs approximately \$42,410 for grouting, filter media replacement. Career needs pump replacement and main drain upgrade \$9,295.Career ceiling above the pool must be scraped and painted. Paint all surfaces in pool areas, locker rooms, doors and frames. Replace ceiling tile as needed. Drain down water paint pool bottom, repair tiles, and upgrade pool equipment.



LED Lighting Project leveraging capital funds and United Illuminating incentive rebate program in order to maximize lighting upgrades .Lighting upgrades will result in approximately 40% energy savings with payback in 3 years or less.

Bid is out for LED Lighting upgrades throughout the district. These six schools were identified based on various criteria including but not limited to: age, need, associated utility incentive, energy star scoring and safety. The six schools are Wilbur Cross, Wexler Grant, Cooperative Arts, Fair Haven for interior changes and Edgewood, Mauro-Sheridan, for exterior lighting upgrade.

Doosan Fuel cell maintenance agreement has been renewed for the final option year .We must perform an evaluation of the fuel cell to determine our course of action to replace or discontinue the fuel program at the CUP.



Sound School Painting and repairs was bid and awarded the work has begun on four buildings for \$124,320



Truman boiler replacement completed

Celentano boiler replacement completed Fair Haven and Wexler Grant are in process of creating bid documents we actually have PO in place for the assessments.



Various antiquated broken HVAC equipment (pumps, compressors, refrigerant, coils) in need of replacement currently in excess of \$100,000 district wide.

Upgraded Truman and Celentano with new High Efficiency Condensing Water Boilers. Stainless steel heat exchangers.



Facilities met with Ed D'Angelo from Public works and Maggie Targove to trade in old antiquated vans for new vans for tradesmen.

These funds will be used to upgrade and replace vehicles for various departments as they become antiquated or unsafe and beyond their useful life. The following is the list from our 10 year vehicle replacement program of current vehicle needs;

- A. Food Service truck-approved
- B. Security passenger vehicle.
- C. Tradesman vans- (5) vans on order
- D. Snow plowing vehicles.

The food truck purchase (\$90,000) was approved at the F&O meeting on Monday February 3, 2020 The (5) trades vans are in the approval process. Approximately \$150,000 total cost Waiting on delivery of 5 trucks



Facilities has bid out the building of an Automotive Shop at Hillhouse. We are awaiting the award of the project to the sole bidder the cost is \$83,000.



Upgrade replacement of $\underline{\mathbf{A}}$ utomatic $\underline{\mathbf{E}}$ xternal $\underline{\mathbf{D}}$ efibrillators is in process .The current AED's are at the end of their useful life and we are replacing them with new state of the art devices That have been reviewed by the Emergency operations Director and are compatible with City of New haven Fire department and EMT services



Facilities has bid out the building of an Automotive Shop at Hillhouse. We are awaiting the award of the project to the sole bidder the cost is \$83,000.



Edgewood playground is in need of new landscaping we are currently working with city planning to develop a plan to prevent erosion and create a safe surface to play on around the tress and sidewalks.

Upgrade replacement of <u>Automatic External Defibrillators</u> is in process. The current AED's are at the end of their useful life and we are replacing them with new state of the art devices That have been reviewed by the Emergency operations Director and are compatible with City of New haven Fire department and EMT services
