


Everyone 12 years of age and older is now eligible to get a COVID-19 vaccine.

Here are some tips to have a medically accurate, not-uncomfortable chat about COVID-19 vaccines with your parent or guardian. **You got this!**



Is the COVID-19 vaccination even effective in children and teens?

It's super effective! The clinical trial showed that the Pfizer vaccine was 100% effective at preventing COVID-19 with symptoms in children 12 through 15 years old.

Does the vaccine have any serious side effects?

In the clinical trial for children 12 through 15 years old, no safety concerns were identified with the Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine. COVID-19 vaccines have the most intensive safety monitoring in U.S. history!

What if we can't afford the COVID-19 vaccine?

You're too young to get the COVID-19 vaccination.

The CDC now recommends the COVID-19 vaccine for everyone 12 years of age and older. Children 12-17 years old are able to get the Pfizer vaccine with the consent of a parent or quardian.
