Hosted by Dr. Danielle Cooper of University of New Haven's TOW Youth Justice Institute

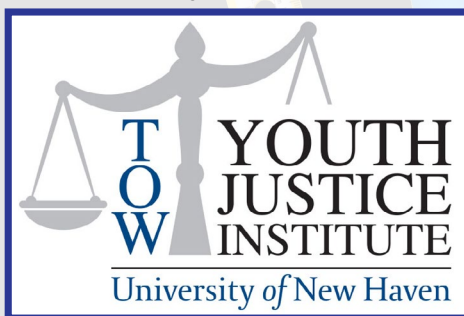
Black History and Afrofuturism

Hosted by Dr. Siobhan Carter-David, SCSU History Professor and Medria Blue-Ellis, New Haven Educator.

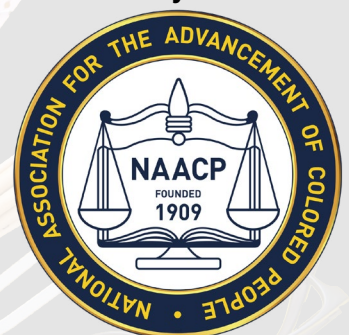
