

English as a Second Language (ESOL) Pull-out or Push-in model	5A, 7A, 03	 This program provides English language support for students who speak a language other than English. Multilingual learner students are placed in a mainstream classroom in which the language of instruction is English. These students receive English language support through small group instruction from an English as a second language teacher or tutor. Teachers may take small groups within the classroom (push-in) or pull students out for instruction. Instruction focuses on English language acquisition and development of the four language domains: speaking, listening, reading, and writing.
