Furthermore, multilingual learners attending non-dual language schools will also gain access to this platform to enhance their English language skills. The other companies did not provide a comprehensive, personalized platform that would cater to the unique requirements of students in both languages; instead, they offered a solution limited to only students who are learning English. In addition, this platform aligns with the new reading resource HMH and Arriba a la Lectura.

In addition, the partnership manager works closely with the multilingual department to support and monitor the usage by teachers per school and review students' growth. Additionally, the department monitors students' growth in both languages to ensure that students are engaged with the digital platform.

It would be fiscally impossible to pay for individual tutors to address the linguistic needs of all the identified multilingual learners in the district. In addition, it will support students enrolled in dual language programs. It also connects with our new core reading program adopted by the district HMH Into Reading and Arriba a la Lectura.
- 13. What are the implications of not approving this Agreement? Students will be unable to benefit from a proven supplemental language and literacy development program, and unable to decrease the achievement gap.

EXHIBIT B

STUDENT DATA PRIVACY AGREEMENT SPECIAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

For the purposes of this Exhibit B "directory information," "de-identified student information," "school purposes," "student information," "student records," "student- generated content," and "targeted advertising" shall be as defined by Conn. Gen. Stat.§10-234aa.

- 1. All student records, student information, and student-generated content (collectively, "student data") provided or accessed pursuant this Agreement or any other services agreement between the Parties are not the property of, or under the control of, the Contractor.
- 2. The Board shall have access to and the ability to delete student data in the possession of the Contractor except in instances where such data is (A) otherwise prohibited from deletion or required to be retained under state or federal law, or (B) stored as a copy as part of a disaster recovery storage system and that is (i) inaccessible to the public, and (ii) unable to be used in the normal course of business by the Contractor. The Board may request the deletion of any such student information, student records or student-generated content if such copy has been used by the operator to repopulate accessible data following a disaster recovery. The Board may request the deletion of student data by the contractor within thirty (30) days of receiving such a request and provide to the Board confirmation via electronic mail that the student data has been deleted in accordance with the request, the date of its deletion, and the manner in which it has been deleted. The confirmation shall contain a written assurance from the Contractor that proper disposal of the data has occurred in order to prevent the unauthorized access or use of student data and that deletion has occurred in accordance with industry standards/practices/protocols.
- 3. The Contractor shall not use student data for any purposes other than those authorized pursuant to this Agreement.
- 4. A student, parent or legal guardian of a student may review personally identifiable information contained in student data and correct any erroneous information, if any, in such student data. If the Contractor receives a request to review student data in the Contractor's possession directly from a student, parent, or guardian, the Contractor agrees to refer that individual to the Board and to notify the Board within two (2) business days of receiving such a request. The Contractor agrees to work cooperatively with the Board to permit a student, parent, or guardian to review personally identifiable information in student data that has been shared with the Contractor, and correct any erroneous information therein.

- 5. The Contractor shall take actions designed to ensure the security and confidentiality of student data.
- 6. The Contractor will notify the Board, in accordance with Conn. Gen. Stat. § 10-234dd, when there has been an unauthorized release, disclosure or acquisition of student data. Such notification will include the following steps:

Upon discovery by the Contractor of a breach of student data, the Contractor shall conduct an investigation and restore the integrity of its data systems and, without unreasonable delay, but not more than thirty (30) days after such discovery, shall provide the Board with a more detailed notice of the breach, including but not limited to the date and time of the breach; name(s) of the student(s) whose student data was released, disclosed or acquired; nature of and extent of the breach; and measures taken to ensure that such a breach does not occur in the future.

- 7. Student data shall not be retained or available to the Contractor upon expiration of the contract between the Contractor and Board, except a student, parent or legal guardian of a student may choose independently to establish or maintain an electronic account with the Contractor after the expiration of such contract for the purpose of storing student- generated content.
- 8. The Contractor and Board shall each ensure their own compliance with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, 20 U.S.C. § 1232g, as amended from time to time.
- 9. The Contractor acknowledges and agrees to comply with the above and all other applicable aspects of Connecticut's Student Data Privacy law according to Connecticut General Statutes §§ 10-234aa through 10-234dd.
- 10. The Parties agree that this Agreement controls over any inconsistent terms or conditions contained within any other agreement entered into by the Parties concerning student data.

- The district exceeded its 30-minute weekly usage goal in both Language and Español!
- A class at Fair Haven won the National Competition, Ready, Set...Read for averaging 240+ minutes with Imagine Learning.
- On average, K-5 students showed growth in both Literacy and Vocabulary from Benchmark I to III.






- The district met the usage goal of 30 minutes but would like to take a deeper dive into how teachers are utilizing the platform. We discussed setting up a monthly data cadence that each site receives with targeted resources and data to prompt teacher action.

Are there any current obstacles preventing the successful implementation of Imagine Learning?

- Tech Fatigue We discussed looking more at how teachers can utilize the platform in the homeroom setting as a resource that save times rather than gives them another thing to do.
- PD One concern was the staff shortage this last year and the ability for the district to schedule PD to let teachers know what resources are available. Valery will work with the team to schedule a summer school PD and provide key notes, as well as identify an alternative PD option that is more flexible.
