Regular communication, site visits, and feedback will ensure that Farm2X effectively meets the school's needs and performance goals.

- 14. What are the implications of not approving this Agreement? Not approving this Agreement would have several implications for Nathan Hale School. Firstly, it would mean missing out on the opportunity to establish and maintain an educational garden, which can enrich students' learning experiences and align with curriculum objectives. Secondly, the school may face challenges in creating hands-on, experiential learning opportunities related to gardening and sustainability. Additionally, without the expertise and support provided by Farm2X, the school may struggle to effectively manage and integrate the garden into its educational programs. Lastly, the potential for community engagement and partnerships may be lost, impacting the school's broader educational ecosystem. In essence, not approving this Agreement could result in missed educational and community benefits for the school.

AGREEMENT By And Between The New Haven Board of Education AND

This Agreement entered into on the 14th day of November 2023, effective (<u>no sooner than the day after Board of Education Approval</u>), the 14th day of November, 2023, by and between the New Haven Board of Education (herein referred to as the "Board" and, Trifecta Ecosystems located at, 225 Oak Street, New Britain CT 06050 (herein referred to as the "Contractor".

Compensation: The Board shall pay the contractor for satisfactory performance of services required in the amount of \$60,000 with an initial deposit of \$30,000 to begin the project, the remaining \$30,000 to be due when the Garden builds are completed

The maximum amount the contractor shall be paid under this agreement: Sixty Thousand dollars (\$60,000). Compensation will be made upon submission of <u>an itemized invoice which includes a detailed description of work performed and date of service.</u>

SCOPE OF SERVICE: Trifecta Ecosystems (Farm2X) offers comprehensive farm to school services and for Nathan Hale School they will be constructing a large raised bed garden, modifying existing raised beds, adding a pollinator garden, as well as clearing a large overgrown area for a future Berry Patch/garden area. The raised bed will be built with decorative wall blocks and the pollinator garden will be planted directly in the soil with new mulch; these two areas will create an outdoor learning area. Trifecta will provide vegetable transplants, automated irrigation, and hand-tools, along with a seasonal planting schedule and lesson plans for all grade levels. The service contract involves workshops, ongoing curriculum development, and maintenance, addressing deficiencies, mechanical issues, and supplying needed materials. Maintenance occurs twice monthly during the school year and weekly in summer, with opportunities for student involvement and community engagement through Farm2X educators' assistance in creating

classroom integrations. In addition, there will be two Hydroponic systems as part of this project that will be installed on the main floor of the school, which will create an indoor learning environment centered on food production.

HOLD HARMLESS: The Contractor shall insure and/or indemnify the Board and its members, employees and agents against all claims, suits, and expenses, including reasonable attorney's fees, in connection with loss of life, bodily injury or property damage arising from any neglect act or omission of the Contractor or its employees or agents. Further, the Contractor covenants and agrees that it shall hold the Board and its members, employees and agents harmless against any and all claims, suits judgments of any description whatsoever caused by the Contractor' breach of this agreement or based upon the conduct of the Contractor, or its agents or its employees or arising out of in connection with their activities under this agreement.

TERMINATION: The Board may cancel this agreement for any reason upon thirty (30) days' written notice sent to the Contractor by certified U.S. mail, return receipt requested; provided however, that the Board shall be responsible to the Contractor for all services rendered by the Contractor through the last day of thirty (30) day notice period, as long as the Agreement was approved by the Board prior to the start date of service.

EXHIBIT B

STUDENT DATA PRIVACY AGREEMENT SPECIAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

For the purposes of this Exhibit B "directory information," "de-identified student information," "school purposes," "student information," "student records," "student generated content," and "targeted advertising" shall be as defined by Conn. Gen. Stat.§10-234aa.

- 1. All student records, student information, and student-generated content (collectively, "student data") provided or accessed pursuant this Agreement or any other services agreement between the Parties are not the property of, or under the control of, the Contractor.
- 2. The Board shall have access to and the ability to delete student data in the possession of the Contractor except in instances where such data is (A) otherwise prohibited from deletion or required to be retained under state or federal law, or (B) stored as a copy as part of a disaster recovery storage system and that is (i) inaccessible to the public, and (ii) unable to be used in the normal course of business by the Contractor. The Board may request the deletion of any such student information, student records or student generated content if such copy has been used by the operator to repopulate accessible data following a disaster recovery. The Board may request the deletion of student data by the contractor within two (2) business days of receiving such a request and provide to the Board confirmation via electronic mail that the student data has been deleted in accordance with the request, the date of its deletion, and the manner in which it has been deleted. The confirmation shall contain a written assurance from the Contractor that proper disposal of the data has occurred in order to prevent the unauthorized access or use of student data and that deletion has occurred in accordance with industry standards/practices/protocols.
- 3. The Contractor shall not use student data for any purposes other than those authorized pursuant to this Agreement.
- 4. A student, parent or legal guardian of a student may review personally identifiable information contained in student data and correct any erroneous information, if any, in such student data. If the Contractor receives a request to review student data in the Contractor's possession directly from a student, parent, or guardian, the Contractor agrees to refer that individual to the Board and to notify the Board within two (2) business days of receiving such a request. The Contractor agrees to work cooperatively with the Board to permit a student, parent, or guardian to review personally identifiable information in student data that has been shared with the Contractor, and correct any erroneous information therein.

- 5. The Contractor shall take actions designed to ensure the security and confidentiality of student data.
- 6. The Contractor will notify the Board, in accordance with Conn. Gen. Stat. § 10-234dd, when there has been an unauthorized release, disclosure or acquisition of student data. Such notification will include the following steps:

Upon discovery by the Contractor of a breach of student data, the Contractor shall conduct an investigation and restore the integrity of its data systems and, without unreasonable delay, but not more than thirty (30) days after such discovery, shall provide the Board with a more detailed notice of the breach, including but not limited to the date and time of the breach; name(s) of the student{s} whose student data was released, disclosed or acquired; nature of and extent of the breach; and measures taken to ensure that such a breach does not occur in the future.

- 7. Student data shall not be retained or available to the Contractor upon expiration of the contract between the Contractor and Board, except a student, parent or legal guardian of a student may choose independently to establish or maintain an electronic account with the Contractor after the expiration of such contract for the purpose of storing student generated content.
- 8. The Contractor and Board shall each ensure their own compliance with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, 20 U.S.C. § 1232g, as amended from time to time.
- 9. The Contractor acknowledges and agrees to comply with the above and all other applicable aspects of Connecticut's Student Data Privacy law according to Connecticut General Statutes §§ 10-234aa through 10-234dd.
- 10. The Parties agree that this Agreement controls over any inconsistent terms or conditions contained within any other agreement entered into by the Parties concerning student data.
